



CLEARCorps Member Description for the American Lung Association of the Northwest's (ALANW) Master Home Environmentalist© (MHE) Program

The ALANW's MHE program's goal is to promote health by reducing pollutants in the home such as lead, dust, biological contaminants, etc. through education and action. It is our intent to have all homes become a safe and healthy environment for all family members.

Qualifications:

High School Degree or GED, or must complete either during term of service; must be a US citizen; must be at least 17 years of age. The successful candidate must have a strong interest in environmental health issues, asthma and community. Highly motivated individuals with strong interpersonal skills, a willingness to learn, and the ability to self manage a plus. Member must be a nonsmoker. Ability to use computer programs, Word and Excel a must, PowerPoint and database experience helpful. Bilingual language skills highly desirable. Must have valid drivers license, own vehicle, and insurance.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Perform HEALs as needed (In-Home Assessments)
- Evaluate program success by distributing follow up surveys to participating households; record behavior changes and perceived health benefits; compile success stories; target and record program areas of improvement
- Read all MHE manuals; take all manual chapter tests; complete two day intensive MHE volunteer training; organize all MHE training materials; record all manual corrections and areas of improvement
- Participate in health fairs, community events and other outreach activities
- Coordinate delivery of devices such as mattress covers and peak flow meters as well as ALANW publications, brochures, and fact sheets
- Answer Indoor Air Quality and MHE questions as needed
- Assist in coordinating volunteer activities and volunteer retention
- Data base entry/maintenance
- Other responsibilities as necessary
